UNIVERSITY-WIDE LOWER-LEVEL REQUIREMENTS (28 credits): The integrative studies requirement is fulfilled by taking: (1) a 4-credit Tier I writing course in Writing, Rhetoric and American Culture (WRA); (2) 8 credits in Arts and Humanities (IAH); (3) 8 credits in Social, Behavioral and Economic Science (ISS), including one course at the 300-level; (4) 8 credits, including a two-credit lab, in General Science (one ISB and one ISP, plus the lab that goes with one of these courses). Among the four IAH and ISS courses, students must have courses with at least two different letters (D/I/N). There is also a mathematics requirement.

Note: Not more than 40 of the credits a student counts towards graduation (i.e., 120 credits, or 123 if the student took MTH 1825) may be in History. However, a student who graduates with more than the minimum number of credits may take History courses beyond the initial 40-credit maximum.

NOTE: The following College of Social Science requirements of the non-education History major are waived for the History Education major. Students who switch from History Education to History will be required to complete these requirements:

- 15 credits in the College of Social Science outside the student's major. 12 of these 15 credits must be in one discipline or on one theme
- 9 credits in the College of Arts and Letters and/or in Music. Foreign language credits may be used to fulfill this requirement whole or in part
- 6 credits in the College of Natural Science or approved substitute courses
